## New Course offered during Sophomore Year

This year, Glenbard South offered a new course for our students during their sophomore year - AP Seminar: English. This course is a year-long interdisciplinary course that challenges students to think critically about contemporary world issues. Students are developing inquiry skills through writing, reasoning, and collaboration while exploring a variety of topics across multiple disciplines. This course is a natural overlap with D87 standards for English 2 Honors and a great opportunity for our students. Our current students and students are enjoying this class tremendously this year and we look forward to welcoming our next group of students next year.

Families had the opportunity to learn about individual Advanced Placement and Dual Credit courses at Glenbard South during our **Advanced Placement and Dual Credit Informational Session** on December 3. New courses at Glenbard South include:

#### • AP Macroeconomics

While this course is not new, it has not been run at Glenbard South in a number of years. The College Board describes this course as one where "students cultivate their understanding of the principles that apply to an economic system as a whole by using principles and models to describe economic situations and predict and explain outcomes with graphs, charts, and data as they explore concepts like economic measurements, markets, macroeconomic models, and macroeconomic policies." More information can be found <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>. This course is open to 11th and 12th grade students.

The following courses were new to Glenbard South last year (starting in the 2024-25 school year):

• AP Seminar: English

Year-long interdisciplinary course that challenges students to think critically about contemporary world issues from multiple perspectives. 10th Grade; replaces English 2 Honors

• AP Precalculus

Functions and their transformations, compositions and inverses through verbal, graphical, numerical and analytical representations. 12th Grade only.

Entrepreneurship 1161 (Dual Credit)

Explore the entrepreneurial approach with others as it relates to careers, business, social responsibility, and startup growth.

• Fundamentals Of Speech Communication 1100 (Dual Credit)

This college-level oral communication course combines communication theory with the practice of oral communication skills. This is a dual credit course through the College of Dupage and is designed to fulfill general education requirements. Speech 1100 is offered at no cost and is transferable to many colleges and universities through a COD transcript. This course fulfills the speech requirement for graduation. This course is open to 11th and 12th grade students.

• Intro To Education 1100 and School Procedure 1101 (Dual Credit)

An introduction to teaching as a profession in the American education system; policies, procedures, and routine activities that are part of the teacher's role.

Intro to Horticulture and Intro to Sustainable Urban Agriculture (Dual Credit)

The development, production, and use of horticultural crops; the principles of sustainable agriculture for urban production.

During Raider Hour Advisory on Friday, December 2, all 9th, 10th and 11th grade students viewed an **Electives Presentation** describing the elective opportunities in our elective departments. <u>This video</u> highlights many of the great elective classes offered here at Glenbard South. Remember that our core departments also offer a wide variety of elective courses. All courses offered at Glenbard South are described in the Academic Program Guide, linked <u>here</u>. Please talk to your student's School Counselor during the enrollment process if you have any questions.

#### **ACT PREP COURSE**

While registration for the District 87 FREE ACT Prep course for Glenbard Juniors is officially closed, there are a limited number of seats remaining. The ACT Prep course is provided by Academic Approach, a leading test preparation provider. Scoring well on the ACT affords students with post-secondary opportunities, including scholarships and admission to competitive colleges and universities.

## **School Counseling**

#### **Enrollment Information For Next Year**

Parents, we value your input in this process. You best understand your own student's interests and postsecondary goals. You also see how the overall academic rigor of his or her schedule affects their daily functioning. Selecting the right courses not only prepares students for life after high school, but also creates opportunities for students to challenge their academic abilities.

#### Families should complete the following checklist within the timeline below:

#### December 2nd

- All freshmen, sophomores, and juniors reviewed the online enrollment process and received course enrollment forms during Raider Hour Advisory. Please ask your student to share their enrollment form with you. Your signature is required.
- An email went out to families listing all core class recommendations.

#### December 17th

 All freshmen, sophomores, and juniors will return their completed enrollment forms to their 2nd period teachers. Students will be encouraged to take a picture of their enrollment form prior to handing it in. Please note that although we collect these forms at this time, the course requests are not finalized until your student meets with their school counselor in January.

#### December 2nd-January 6th

- Parents and students will be able to edit their core course recommendations and must enter their other course selections into Powerschool.
- Students who have an IEP will have access to view their course selections which will be chosen through an individualized team process.

#### January 8th-January 24th

- After the Powerschool portal closes, students will meet individually with their school counselors to review course selections. School Counselors will reach out to students to set up these meetings when we return from Winter Break.
- It is essential that your student gives careful consideration to their course requests. Any
  changes after January 24th must be discussed with the student's School Counselor and will be
  on a space available basis.

#### **Technical Center of DuPage!**

Juniors and Seniors have the option of requesting a program at TCD as part of their elective choices for enrollment. Parents and interested students should go to <a href="www.tcdupage.org">www.tcdupage.org</a> page to view current program description. Please watch <a href="this short video">this short video</a> if you want to know what TCD is and what it can offer your student. These descriptions and the video will assist students in learning

more about the programs at TCD. If your student decides to apply for TCD for next year, please indicate "TCD" on the enrollment form PLUS two programs your student is interested in. Please note that space is limited and that there is an additional online application required. Your counselor will give you the link to the application when you meet with them in January for your enrollment one on one meeting.

On December 5th, counselors took a group of interested sophomores and juniors to TCD to explore the programs they have available. For students who did not get a chance to attend the field trip and for parents that want to explore the facilities themselves, **TCD** is hosting an Open House on January 16th from 6:30-8pm. No RSVP necessary.

#### **FAFSA**

As a reminder, a non-academic graduation requirement for seniors is that they either need to file the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u> (FAFSA) or complete the FAFSA Non-Participation Form. The non-participation digital form is now available <u>here</u>.

On Monday, December 9th, Glenbard South hosted a virtual FSA ID workshop for students and families. The FSA ID is the first step in completing the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u> (FAFSA), and is the creation of a username and password. If you missed the workshop, you are still able to create an FSA ID on your own. Please allow at least 24 hours before filing FAFSA. See below for the zoom links to future workshop dates and times.
