School-day Supports for All Students

Our new schedule allows multiple times during the school day for all students to meet with teachers and their peers to make sure everyone is finding success in their classes. As we begin Semester Two, we encourage you to talk with your student about how they are using this time during the school day to its fullest potential.

1 - Raider Hour

As we began during the last school year, each Monday and Friday, our students experience Raider Hour between periods 2 and 3.

- Approximately one third of these days are Advisory Sessions (indicated in blue on the calendar below), where students meet with two Advisory Teachers to go over important SEL Lessons, attend a Pep Rally, or participate in other school culture lessons.
- The other (approximately) two thirds of these days are **Agency Sessions** (indicated in red on the calendar below), where students are able to use the D87 App to schedule time to meet with available teachers.
- As we begin Semester Two, we encourage you to talk to your student about using this time to
 meet with the teachers of the courses where they need the most support. If their teacher is
 not available, often another teacher of the same content can help. Students can schedule their
 sessions up to four sessions in advance, so all are encouraged to plan ahead so they are able
 to get the help and support they need.

2 - Collaboration Hour

On Block Days, all students will eat lunch during 7th Period (Wednesday) or 8th Period (Thursday). This means that their typical lunch period (4, 5, or 6) is a Collaboration Hour. This 90-minute period, once per week, is an invaluable time for students to catch up, get ahead, or work with a teacher for extra support.

All Freshmen and Sophomores are required to stay on campus and can choose to work quietly in a study hall environment, meet with a teacher (by appointment), or work with peers in the LRC, AP Cafe, Math Lab, or Writing Center. Juniors and Seniors with parent permission are given off campus privileges, as long as they are passing all of their classes. Grades are reviewed every three weeks. However, Juniors and Seniors are always welcome to stay on campus to work with a teacher or their peers.

SPRING TESTING DAYS

April 10, 2025: All Juniors at Glenbard South will take the Schoolday ACT with Essay. This exam will be administered digitally, on student iPads.

 This is a non-attendance day for 9th, 10th, and 12th grade students.

April 9, 2025: All 9th and 10th grade students at Glenbard South will take the pre-ACT. This exam will be administered digitally, on student iPads.

- This is a non-attendance day for 11th, and 12th grade students

 May 5-9 and May 12-16: AP Exams administered at Glenbard South.
 - Each exam is administered on a different day, based on a schedule set by the College Board. Students registered for the exam in the Fall through AP Classroom. Please see this link for specific dates for each exam.






Donation to the Boosters

How to Apply for NHS

== 2nd Semester of Junior year ==

National Honor Society is based on four tenets: Leadership, Scholarship, Character and Service. All of these things play a role in determining your eligibility. Most importantly work hard to maintain a strong GPA all four years and get involved in volunteer opportunities prior to applying.

Step 1 : January-Mid February

To be eligible to receive an application you must have maintained a GPA of 3.44 or above through the first semester of your junior year. After finals, the sponsor receives a list of eligible candidates. Copies of the application are prepared for distribution to students' 2nd or 3rd period classes. Most applications are delivered by the 2nd week in February. If you feel your student is eligible but has not received an application by this time please contact the sponsor to check on your individual case.



Step 2: Mid-February - Mid-March

Once the student has their application, it is their job to turn it in

when it is completed by the due date listed on the application. No late applications are accepted! In addition to filling out their membership information packet they must solicit 4 teacher or coach recommendations. AGAIN- IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE STUDENT TO MAKE SURE ALL APPLICATION MATERIALS ARE TURNED IN ON OR BEFORE THE DUE DATE INDICATED. NO LATE APPLICATIONS WILL BE CONSIDERED.

School Counseling

Enrollment Season is Upon Us!

Counselors are meeting with current freshmen, sophomores and juniors throughout the month of January in a one on one setting. At these meetings, counselors are reviewing students' credits, class selection for next year and reviewing option summer school as needed. The Academic Program Guidebook is available on our website to help you better understand our course offerings.

If you have a junior/senior athlete, or a member of our marching band, and your student plans to apply for a **pe waiver** to take an additional academic class, please make sure they communicate this with their counselor when we meet. Deadline to file for a PE waiver is January 31, 2025. The PE waiver form can be found on our website, under students, school counseling.

FAFSA required for seniors!

A non-academic **graduation requirement** for seniors this year is that you either need to file the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u> (FAFSA), or the <u>Alternate Application for Illinois Financial Aid</u>. Please note that if you fill out the Non-participation form, you can change your mind and apply for FAFSA later.

It is not too late to apply for college!! Many deadlines are between January 1st and February 1st.

Butler - February 1 for regular decision (rolling after)

DePaul - February 1 for regular decision

Dominican University - rolling after priority date of November 15

Elmhurst - rolling after their Early Action of November 1

Indiana (Bloomington) - February 1 for regular decision

Illinois State - rolling as space allows after November 1 priority deadline

Iowa State University - rolling admission

Michigan State University - February 1 for regular decision, rolling admission after

North Central - rolling admission

Purdue - January 15 regular decision

UIC - February 1 regular decision

UIUC - January 5 regular decision

University of Iowa - rolling admission
