ACT Review Materials available for Glenbard Students

We are excited to share that all students grades 9 - 11 have access to Albert, an online learning tool, to support their preparation for the school-day ACT and preACT in April, 2025. Albert helps your student practice ACT® type questions and get immediate feedback.

Your student received instructions through an email to their Glenbard Gmail address. Most students have already used Albert in their classes, but if they need any support, this document will show them how to access their account.

School-day Supports for All Students

- Each Monday and Friday, our students experience Raider Hour between periods 2 and 3.
 - Advisory Sessions (indicated in blue on the calendar below), where students meet with two Advisory Teachers to go over important SEL Lessons, attend a Pep Rally, or participate in other school culture lessons.
 - **Agency Sessions** (indicated in red on the calendar below), where students are able to use the D87 App to schedule time to meet with available teachers.
 - Students can schedule their sessions up to four sessions in advance, so all are encouraged to plan ahead so they are able to get the help and support they need.

2 - Collaboration Hour

On Block Days, all students will eat lunch during 7th Period (Wednesday) or 8th Period (Thursday). This means that their typical lunch period (4, 5, or 6) is a Collaboration Hour. This 90-minute period, once per week, is an invaluable time for students to catch up, get ahead, or work with a teacher for extra support.

All Freshmen and Sophomores are required to stay on campus and can choose to work quietly in a study hall environment, meet with a teacher (by appointment), or work with peers in the LRC, AP Cafe, Math Lab, or Writing Center. Juniors and Seniors with parent permission are given off campus privileges, as long as they are passing all of their classes. Grades are reviewed every three weeks. However, Juniors and Seniors are always welcome to stay on campus to work with a teacher or their peers.

SPRING TESTING DAYS

April 10, 2025: All Juniors at Glenbard South will take the Schoolday ACT with Essay. This exam will be administered digitally, on student iPads.

 This is a non-attendance day for 9th, 10th, and 12th grade students.

April 9, 2025: All 9th and 10th grade students at Glenbard South will take the pre-ACT. This exam will be administered digitally, on student iPads.

- This is a non-attendance day for 11th, and 12th grade students
 May 5-9 and May 12-16: AP Exams administered at Glenbard South.
 - Each exam is administered on a different day, based on a schedule set by the College Board. Students registered for the exam in the Fall through AP Classroom. Please see this link for specific dates for each exam.




Congratulations

As someone born, raised and educated in the state of Illinois, I am proud to call Illinois home and plan to do so for life. I believe strongly that my character and view of the world as a citizen and as an architect has been shaped by the cultural, geographic, economic, historic, and architectural diversity of our state.

Explain the meaning behind your flag

The four dark blue bars in this submission represent the four geographic features that hold the greatest geographic, economic, and historic significance in the creation of Illinois: Lake Michigan, the Mississippi River, the Ohio River, and the Chicago River/ Illinois River system. The corn kernels and 21-pronged gear that form our state flower, the violet, represent the agricultural and industrial foundations of our state and its status as the 21st state admitted to the Union.

Violence and Bullying Hotline

At Glenbard South, we offer a violence and bullying hotline which allows students to provide anonymous information to school officials regarding potential school threats or bullying incidents. The number is (630) 534-4230.

Additionally, students can text a CRISIS Test Line: Text HOME to 74141 which sends information to a Crisis Counselor, a real-life human trained to help individuals return to a healthy/stable level of functioning.

The State of Illinois launched a school safety program last year called Safe2Help Illinois in an effort to raise awareness of the 21st century threats facing schoolchildren in Illinois. Safe2Help Illinois will offer students a safe, confidential way in which to share information that might help prevent suicides, bullying, school violence or other threats to school safety. This program is intended to get students to "Seek Help Before Harm." Call 844-472-3345 or Text 72332(SAFE2) to report.

From the Glenbard South Health Office

February is National Children's Dental Health month. You might be surprised to learn that cavities are the most common disease affecting children in the U.S. If left untreated, children are at greater risk for physical health conditions like gum disease and other infections. There is a connection between oral health and mental health including a connection to self esteem and confidence. It is important that your student is practicing good oral hygiene including brushing their teeth twice a day, flossing, and using a toothpaste with fluoride. Additionally, limit sweets, candy and sugary beverages. Another healthy oral tip is to hydrate frequently. Your student should also visit the dentist twice a year. School Counselors Celebrate During National School Counseling Week, Feb. 3-7, 2025

National School Counseling Week 2025, "School Counseling: Helping Students Thrive," sponsored by the American School Counselor Association (ASCA), will be celebrated from Feb. 3-7,

2025, to focus public attention on the unique contribution of school counselors within U.S. school systems and how students are different as a result of what school counselors do. National School Counseling Week highlights the tremendous impact school counselors can have in helping students achieve school success and plan for a career.

School counselors are actively engaged in helping students examine their abilities, strengths, interests and talents; for working in a partnership with parents as they encounter the challenges of raising children in today's world; for focusing on positive ways to enhance students' academic, career and social/emotional development; and working with teachers and other educators to provide an educational system where students can realize their potential and set healthy, realistic and optimistic aspirations for themselves. School counselors are certified, experienced educators with a master's degree in school counseling. The combination of their training and experience makes them an integral part of the total educational program.

"School counselors work with all students to remove barriers to learning by addressing students' academic concerns, career options and social/emotional skills," said Jill Cook, ASCA executive director. "School counseling programs help to increase student achievement and provide a much-

needed resource for students, parents, teachers and administrators. School counselors are integral to student success."

- 1. For those of you that have not created a FSA ID, please use <u>this linked document</u> to create it. It is advised that it is created at least 2 days prior to the filing the FAFSA. Both parents and students need their own FSA ID.
- 2. It is ideal for both students and parents to be in attendance for the in person workshop.
- 3. Please bring your 2023 tax forms, W-2s, and social security numbers for you and your student.
- 4. Please also have a final list of colleges your senior is applying to.

Academic Success & Future Planning for 2nd Semester

As we begin the second semester, now is the time to focus on your academic progress! Your grades directly impact your GPA, which plays a key role in college admissions, scholarships, and future opportunities.

Maximize Your Academic Resources:

Use Raider Hour wisely – Sign up in Glenbard Hour to meet with teachers for extra support or

review.

Benefits of College Visits

College visits are a vital part of the college investigation process. Whether you are a freshman at the beginning stages of the college process or a senior trying to make a final decision, college visits can have a powerful impact. There is nothing quite like experiencing a college campus first hand. In many cases, investing in a college education might be one of the most significant financial investments one ever makes. Getting a chance to visit multiple campuses provides the added research needed so you can feel confident about whatever choice you make.

Here are 4 benefits of college visits:

- 1. Get a better "feel" of the campus. Each campus has a different style; something that makes it unique. Some campuses are large and spread out, while other campuses are small and compact. Getting a feel of the college environment can help students decide if a large state school or a small liberal arts school is a better fit.
- 2. Going on a college tour. Tours can take students into a classroom, meet students and faculty, and even get a chance to see what a dorm room looks like. This helps students to start to formulate what is important to them. For example, how do they feel about large class sizes? What benefits does dorm life provide?
- 3. Chance to ask lots of questions. College visits allow you to ask questions that you didn't even know you had. The process can be overwhelming, but having a chance to get on campus and ask as many questions as possible can be extremely helpful. College admission counselors are ready and eager to answer whatever questions students and parents have. Provides motivation. Like all goals, having a vision of college keeps students motivated.
- 4. Sets a vision for the future. Seeing a college in person and becoming aware of all the exciting possibilities of their future puts a concept that might once have been black and white into color. This vision can help students to remember why every test, every assignment, and all their hard work matters.

Planning a college visit doesn't have to be difficult or even cost any money. The first step will be to visit the college website. Starting with local schools can be a great first step.


Join the Glenbard South Boosters Team ... We Need You!
